Dear Sponsors, Supporters and Well-Wishers of Srivali High School,

Jai Shaṅkar!

I write to you at a time when the entire World is going through a severe upheaval due to the Coronavirus Pandemic. Your school has also not been spared. The School was closed with effect from 23rd March 2020 in view of the strict Lockdown. As of 11 July 2020, the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoHFW), India has confirmed a total of 820,916 cases, 515,385 recoveries and 22,123 deaths in the country. Effective 24th March 2020, a nationwide lockdown was announced for 21 days and further extended it from 14th April, till 3rd May 2020 followed by further two-week extensions starting 3rd and 17th May but with some relaxations. Educational institutions are expected to open only sometime in August/September 2020, subject to Government notification and guidelines. The Government will issue guidelines on maintaining Social Distancing and Sanitisation, which we intend to strictly implement as and when your School re-opens.

Despite the gloom over the Pandemic, the Academic Year 2019-20 has been a highly inspiring year for all of us at Srivali School... for the Students, the School Teachers, the Administration and for the Trustees.

‘Education is not filling a pail, but the lighting of a fire’ – William Butler Yeats. This has been an abiding principle for functioning in all our Educational Institutions, including Srivali High School.

Thanks to the inspired efforts of the School Teachers and unstinted support from the School Administration, the Sponsors and with the Blessings of Parama Pūjya Swāmījī, your School has achieved a Pass result of 95.68% as against the State average of 71.8%. Your School has also performed exceedingly well in the Sports and extra-curricular activities. To put an end to the unhealthy competition among districts in SSLC results, the Karnāṭaka Secondary Education Examination Board (KSEEB) has scrapped the district-wise ranking system from this year and introduced a grading system wherein Districts will receive grades of ‘A’, ‘B’ or ‘C’. Uttara Kannaḍa District has been awarded Grade ‘A’

We are extremely grateful to have received funds from our munificent Donors - Chitrāpur Heritage Foundation of USA, Koṅkaṇī Charitable Fund – USA and numerous other Sponsors and sincerely look forward to a continued and enhanced level of financial support.

We have an outstanding team of people working hard to make sure that Srivali High School becomes one of the top Schools at the District level and we have complete confidence that this will be achieved in the coming years.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all my colleagues on the Board of Trustees, the Sponsors and Donors, the School Administration, the Senior Leadership team for their unstinted support and above all, Parama Pūjya Sadyojāt Shaṅkarāshram Swāmījī for HIS continuous Guidance and Blessings.

The broad functions of the School Committee have been defined as follows:

- a) Hold periodic meetings and maintain proper minutes of the same.
- b) Management and regulation of the functioning of the school.
- c) Maintaining the books of accounts and investing of the funds of the school.
- d) Preparation of Annual Budget estimates.
- e) Appointment of employees (other than the Head of the School).
- f) Introducing new teaching courses after due consideration.
- g) General administration of School including confirmation of appointment, promotion of and disciplinary action of the employees where necessary other than Head, subject to the provisions of the Karnāṭaka Education Act and its rules. Grant of leave other than casual leave, to the staff, other than the Head of the school whose leave will be granted by the Board of Trustees;
- h) Submit a detailed quarterly report to the Board of Trustees on matters relating to the functioning of the school.

B) Performance

- The School has remained closed from 23rd March, 2020 onwards.
- Exams for the 8th and 9th standards could not be held due to the lockdown and as per the Directions from the Board of Education, Students were promoted to the next standard on basis of Students Achievements Tracking System (SATS) – this is the internal assessment of the students' performance during the Academic year.
- The SSLC Board exams for 2019-20 were held from 25th June to 3rd July, 2020.
- A very successful year for the School. The School has retained its position as one of the leading schools in the Uttara Kannaḍa District.
- **Despite the uncertainties due to the Pandemic the School has achieved an impressive 95.68% pass rate in the SSLC Board Examination for 2019-'20 as compared to 97.27% in 2018-'19.**
- The students continued to excel in both their academic and extra-curricular activities such as sports, performing arts, dramatics and other cultural events.

G) Performance

Due to the Covid 19 Pandemic and the subsequent lockdown imposed by the Government of India, the School has remained closed from the 3rd week of March and is yet to re-open.

- The SSLC exams were held in June 2020 this year, once the lockdown eased.
- On 9th April the School announced 8th and 9th Std Annual Examination result in the presence of parents and teachers.
- Remedial classes were conducted from 24/04/2019 to 30/04/2019 for those students who had failed in 9th Std and Re-exam was conducted from 2nd May to 4th May for these students.
- Admissions for the 8th Standard commenced on 24th May 2019.
- School re-opened on 29th May, 2019.
- A PTA for 8th std. students was held on 8th June and both the Parents and Students were introduced to your school's rules and regulations and educational activities
- On 13th June 2019 the School celebrated " World Environment Day" by planting different kinds of plants.
- On 13th June 2019, some of our selected students participated in the Installation program of Interact Club which was conducted by Rotary club Bhaṭkal. Your school teacher Shrī Saṅjya Sheṭṭy guided these participating Students.
- On 15th June 2019, the School inaugurated its " English Learning Club" in the school premises. Shrī Gaṅgādhara Nāik President of Tāluka Kannaḍa Sāhitya Parishat Bhaṭkal inaugurated the club and also distributed Solar lamps to the School's 10th Standard students.
- World Yogā Day was celebrated in the School on 21st June 2019.
- Under the supervision of the Education Department, Bhaṭkal, Gurupreraṇā Training session was conducted at our school for Bhaṭkal Tāluka English language teachers BEO Bhaṭkal from 27th June to 29th June during which, the School Head Mistress Smt. J. General Events in the School during the year:

- On account of World's Deworming Day on 25th September the Tāluka Health Department, Bhaṭkal distributed deworming tablets to our students.
- On 2nd October the School celebrated Gāndhī Jayantī and Lāl Bahādur Shāstrī Jayantī at our school premises by cleaning the school surroundings.
- Shārādā pūjā was performed in the School on 4th October, 2019.
- Mid-term vacation commenced on 10th October and the School re-opened on 21st October.
- Kannaḍa Rājyotsava was celebrated in our school premises on 1st November.
- Under the supervision of the Bhaṭkal Tāluka Health Department, Shrī Irayyā Devāḍigā (The Tāluka Health Officer, Bhaṭkal) organized an awareness program on "Iodine Deficiency Syndrome, effects and treatment" at our school on 11th November.
- Rañjan Indane Agency, Bhaṭkal and the Fire exit office, Bhaṭkal organized an awareness programme on safe uses of LPG at our school. Students, Parents and Teachers all participated in this programme.
- On 19th November, 10th std. students of the School were administered the T.D. injection (Tetanus and Diphtheria Vaccine) by the Tāluka Health Department, Bhaṭkal.
- 'Constitution' day also known as Saṁvidhāna Divasa, was observed on 26th November in the School. This day is celebrated in India every year to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India. On 26th November, 1949, the Constituent Assembly of India adopted the Constitution of India, and it came into effect on 26th January, 1950.
- The "Annual Social Gathering" of our School was held on 29th November and a Prize Distribution programme was held at our School in the presence of Smt. Roopā Karvi, The Head Mistress of Vidya Bhārati English-medium School Bhaṭkal and Smt. Jyoti Harin Haṭṭaṅgaḍy presented the prizes to the students.

- On 7th December, a Literary Workshop was conducted at our school premises under the guidance of Literature Club, Bhaṭkal. Shrī Umesh Muṅḍalli was the president of this workshop. The senior lyricist Shrī Sumukānand Jalavalli, Shrī Chandrashekar Paḍuvaṇi, Smt Jayashrī Āchārī and Shrī N.R. Hegde trained the students interested in Story and Poem writing.
- Our student Yashodhā Nāik and Sāhanā P participated in the Tāluka- level 'Yuvā Saṁsat' competition held on 11th December and got the 1st place.
- On 17th December, Smt. Tanujā Naḍkarṇī visited our school and observed our educational activities and on 18th December Shrī Hemant Mādev Gouḍā, Airport officer visited our school and observed the school's curricular activities.
- On 20th December, Shrī Irayyā Devāḍigā, (The Health officer, Government Hospital Bhaṭkal) visited the School and gave a brief speech on HIV and its precaution methods.
- Sāvitrī Bāi Phule Birth anniversary was celebrated at the school on 3rd January.
- Shibirārthī-s of the Sāraswat community from Rājasthān attending a Shibir at Shrī Chitrāpur Math visited the School on 3rd January and were very happy to witness the School's curricular activities.
- In a Proud moment for the School, our 10th Std. student Yashodhā Nāik participated in the State-level Youth Parliament on 9th January and got 7th place among top 10.
- On 9th January 2020, our Scouts and Guides students participated in a training camp held at Durgāparameshwarī Hall, Alvekoḍi.
- Under the supervision of the Village Pañchāyat, a Shirālī Children's Grāma Sabhā was conducted at MHPS Chitrāpur on 24th January. Some of our selected students participated in this "Grāma Sabhā" and performed well.

- On the occasion of 'National Election Day' on 26th January students participated in an oath-taking function at our school.
- The 71st Republic Day was celebrated in the School on 26th January. Shrī Vighneshwar Bhaṭ (The Manager of Vijaya Bank, Shirālī) hoisted the flag and addressed the students.
- On the occasion of 'National Martyrs' Day' on 30th January, the students gathered to offer a Silent Prayer as a small tribute to the Martyrs.
- On 6th February Smt. Shivānī, Shrī Lakshman, Sañjay and Sandhyā (Family) from Australia and Erṇākuṭam, visited our school.
- Swāmījī-s from Sarvīṭ Sādhanāyana, Mount Ābu visited our school to observe the daily activities of our school and appreciated the achievements of our students and all staff members.
- Miss. Sunitā Madam a counseling expert visited our school and trained our teachers regarding child psychology.
- On 10th February, Shwetā Mañjeshwar visited our school and observed our school co-curricular activities.
- On 11th February our student Darshan V Nāik participated in the Division-level Drawing Competition in Dhārwaḍ and secured the 4th place. The Department of Archaeology and its protection conducted this competition.
- "Yuvā Spandana Association Kārwar" conducted an awareness program on personal and mental problems, at our school on 13th February. Students of the 9th and 10th std participated and availed of its benefits.

K. Strategy planned by School upon re-opening of the School in this Covid Era

1. After discussing with the Teachers and the Parents of Students, it was felt that School can re-open after the 15th of August. However, this will depend entirely on Government notification regarding the date of School re-opening.
2. The School has 380 students (8th, 9th & 10th).
3. There are Six Classrooms available.
4. Usually 3 students occupy a desk of 6' length. However, keeping social distancing in mind, the plan is to have only two students occupying one 6' desk.
5. Normally, there are approx. 60 students for each class and each class has two divisions.
6. However, with social distancing norms, only 40-45 students can be accommodated now in each class.
7. Thus, the number of Divisions will increase to three for each standard. This means 9 class rooms would be required, which are not available. Hence, there is a need to plan a workable strategy to operate the School upon re-opening.
8. Strategy
 - a. 8th and 9th Standard students will attend School on alternate days along with 10th Standard students.
 - b. 10th Standard students will attend every day.
 - c. Thus, on one day, 8th and 10th standard students (3 classrooms for each; thus, a total of 6 classrooms). On the next day, 9th and 10th standard students will attend (again, only 6 classrooms will be required).
 - d. However, with this option, completing the entire year's portion will be very difficult especially for the 8th and 9th Standard students. There is a possibility of the Education Department curtailing the portion to be covered in the current academic year.
 - e. The school timing will be either from 9 am to 3 pm or 10 am to 4 pm with a 45- minute break for lunch. Most Parents prefer the 9 am to 3 pm timing.
 - f. During Lunch Break, all students will not be sent for lunch together. First, the Boys will be sent for Lunch and thereafter, the Girls.
 - g. Proper social- distancing norms will be observed in the Lunch Hall.

- h. Only 7 periods in a day.
 - i. No Group activities including Bhagvadgītā recitation
9. Requirements -
- a. Sufficient number of Thermal-Screening devices
 - b. Adequate Hand Sanitizers
10. Other Steps to be taken –
- a. Adequate staff will be made available to conduct the thermal screening.
 - b. Parents & other outsiders will be discouraged/not allowed to enter the School premises.
 - c. Daily thorough cleaning of the school premises, including all surfaces that can be touched such as furniture, doors and door handles, staircases and staircase railings, gates using appropriate disinfectant.
 - d. Special care to maintain highest possible Hygiene in the Kitchen.
 - e. Special care to maintain highest possible Hygiene in the Rest-Rooms/Toilets
11. School admissions have commenced and so far 62 students out of the expected 76 students from feeder school AVM have been enrolled.
12. Admissions of students from other schools will commence after the ongoing SSLC exams which is expected to get over by 4th July, 2020.
13. Usually ,to cope with the rush for admissions, the students from other schools are enrolled/admitted upon successfully passing a Test. Such tests will be held around 15th July, 2020 since around 7-8 teachers will be allotted the duty of evaluating the SSLC exam answer papers and will be away for around a week. Such an evaluation centre is in Kumṭā.
14. There are 131 students who are expected to be promoted from 9th standard to 10th standard this year.
15. There was a proposal to consider 'On Line' classes but this is not practical in a rural setting where internet connectivity is a major issue.
16. The Education Department had sought details of the Strategy each school plans to adopt and these details have been provided to the Department.
17. Any finalisation of the Strategy including the above planned strategy will be subject to discussion with and approval of the BEO/ Education Department and as per Guidelines issued by the State Government/Education Department.

Vocational Training Centre

- 2019-20 is the third year of vocational training at Srīvalī High School. Out of the students who had undertaken training in 2018-19, about 14 students were still interested in continuing vocational training in 2019-20 as well. The classes for the 14, Standard 9 students started in early June, on Monday and Thursday evenings. The 9th standard students, of the advanced batch had started class by the first week of June. There were 14 to start off with, but soon many left, some because of transport issues and others for various other reasons. Ended with 5 energetic students. But during this time, they did a lot of projects.
- Initially, when the announcement was done that vocational training was to be started for the 8th Standard students, a total of 112 students gave their names. 55 boys and 57 girls. But, as we had only capacity of 80, this list had to be filtered. Head Mistress assigned Ms. Ramyā Madam to help filter this list down to 80. This was done and we ended up with 44 boys and 36 girls. These 80 students were further divided into 5 batches of 16 each and in the last week of June vocational classes started for the new batch. The first two classes went by introducing the children to the tools, safety briefings and breaking up into teams of 4.
- As usual the first project was dedicated to making the bed- switch connection. All students got to do this independently. The second project was to make the two-way switch connections. Here, the students had to work in groups of 4. A special jig was prepared to teach the children the circuit for the two-way switch.
- The third project is the lengthiest of them all and takes a lot of patience, teamwork, hand-eye coordination skills and involves a lot of complex work. Generally, at this point, students find out that the vocational skills class is not a frivolous activity, but requires hard work. The initial thrill of handling tools starts to wear off and students tend to leave. But, this batch of 80 was really tremendous. Each of the teams worked hard and completed their extension box.
- As usual, some of the groups finished their project faster than others so were having spare time on their hands, so, they were given small repair projects, or some needed projects.
- Keshav Sorab mām had asked for a type of arrangement, where the Bhaṭ mām-s’ daily work schedule could be posted. So, after discussing the basic design, the children got busy with the project. Once these were ready, it was time to fix the compartments in the Math. After discussions with Head Mistress, it was decided that we would take an all-girl team to the Math to fix the compartments on the wall. All girls with 100% attendance were chosen for the task. After a few practice-runs in the classrooms these girls came to our Math and fixed the compartments.
- For the next project, we thought we will make something useful for the school. During the monsoon months, students and teachers bring umbrellas and rain coats to school, but there is no place to keep them. It was decided to make pegs for hanging the umbrellas and raincoats. Since we were expecting a lot of yātrī-s from Rājasthān, it was decided that rather fixing it in the school, we would fix it in the guest rooms where it would be of help. So, again the students fixed 16 clothes-peg stands, 16 shelves and 16 extension boxes in the AVM guest house.

- The 8th standard students were kept busy throughout the year till end February, when classes were stopped. They did many small projects- some in their groups of 4, like the step stools. One group also did a shoe-stand for their class. The other major skill they learnt was soldering. They did a welcome board by soldering LED bulbs in series.
- It was coming to the end of the year and as discussed with the Head Mistress, the vocational classes were going to stop at end of February. There was a group of 5 Standard 9 students, for whom the vocational training would end at Srīvalī High School. So as a take away present they were asked to fabricate something for themselves to take home. Two of them decided to make coffee tables with glass tops and the other 3 decided to make mirrors.
- We were honored and blessed by the divine presence of H.H. Shrīmat Saṁvit Somgiri Swāmījī Mahārāj and Their Retinue who visited the school and the vocational class room and the children displayed their skills by making a clothes hanger and presenting it to Swāmījī and Their retinue.
- Thanks to Jyoti pāchchī, Gaṇesh Baṅkeshwar mām and Dilip Paḍuṇe mām for their continued support in conducting classes and special thanks to Shrī Om Gaṇesh for his generous donation of LED bulb and holders and time in helping with the WELCOME board.
- Thanks also to the support of all the staff and Head Mistress of Srīvalī High School, entire staff of Shrī Chitrāpur Math and especially to PARAMA PŪJYA SWĀMĪJĪ for Their continued BLESSINGS in making this vocational training successful.
